Bank of Canada Governor Tiff Macklem said that monetary policy is working and he expected inflation to return to the central bank's 2% target by 2024. Canada's headline inflation rate dropped to 7.0% in August, with core inflation running at about 5%.

He added that there was scope for slowing the economy, since the economy had a large number of job vacancies in the labor market.

Earlier Poilievre had said," "It feels like everything is broken in this country right now." He referred to the findings of massive waste in Covid-19 expenses by the federal Auditor General Karen Hogan. He mentioned the issues of inflation, the high cost of housing, the tent cities that have popped up across the country, record foodbank use, increasing taxes, the government's inability to properly deal with Chinese interference in our elections etc.
