Canada has worked out a new system for preferential grant of Permanent Residentship in the interest of removing labour shortages and for making the system transparent to those, who want to come to Canada.

## Appendix 1:

#### The TEER System

The system outlines the level of Training, Education, Experience and Responsibilities (TEER) required to enter each occupation.

- **TEER 0:** Management occupations
- **TEER 1:** Completion of a university degree; or several years of experience in a specific occupation from TEER category 2
- TEER 2: Completion of a post-secondary education program of two to three
  years at community college, institute of technology or CÉGEP; or
  Completion of an apprenticeship training program of two to five years; or
  occupations with supervisory or significant safety (police officers and
  firefighters) responsibilities; or Several years of experience in a specific
  occupation from TEER category 3 (when applicable).
- TEER 3: Completion of a post-secondary education program of less than
  two years at community college, institute of technology or CÉGEP; or
  Apprenticeship training of less than 2 years; or More than six months of onthe-job training, training courses or specific work experience with some
  secondary school education; or Several years of experience in a specific
  occupation from TEER category 4 (when applicable).
- **TEER 4:** Completion of secondary school; or Several weeks of on-the-job training with some secondary school education; or Several years of experience in a specific occupation from TEER category 5 (when applicable).
- **TEER 5:** Short work demonstration and no formal educational requirements.

With the transition to NOC 2021, 16 occupations will become newly eligible for Express Entry, while three occupations become ineligible.

#### Appendix 2:

# List of 16 occupations for PREFERENTIAL ENTRY for Foreign nationals

Foreign nationals with work experience in the following 16 occupations are now eligible to apply through Express Entry:

- payroll administrators
- dental assistants and dental laboratory assistants
- nurse aides, orderlies and patient service associates
- pharmacy technical assistants and pharmacy assistants
- elementary and secondary school teacher assistants
- sheriffs and bailiffs
- correctional service officers
- by-law enforcement and other regulatory officers
- estheticians, electrologists and related occupations
- residential and commercial installers and servicers
- pest controllers and fumigators
- · other repairers and servicers
- transport truck drivers
- bus drivers, subway operators and other transit operators
- heavy equipment operators
- aircraft assemblers and aircraft assembly inspectors

Occupations that are now ineligible...

- Other performers
- Program leaders and instructors in recreation, sport, and fitness
- Tailors, dressmakers, furriers, and milliners
