1. January 23, 2023: **B20 Meeting at Gandhinagar:** 3-day meeting of Industry Leaders of G2 countries to deliberate on Climate Change, Innovation, Global Digital Cooperation, Resilient Global Value Chains, Sustainable Economic Development and Financial Inclusion:

Investment Opportunities

At the inaugural session of B20 India Inception Meeting, Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal called on Indian and foreign companies to serve the world by using India as the base. In his Key-note address, he said that Apple Inc had decided to have 25% of its total manufacturing done through India. The Plenary session was held on Monday at Mahatma Mandir, Gandhinagar, Gujarat, India. Besides Mr. Piyush Goyal, the Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw, Bhupendrabhai Patel, the Chief Minister of Gujarat and the G20 Sherpa Amitabh Kant were on the stage in the inaugural session.

250 International delegates, 300 Indian Industry delegates, and delegates from multilateral organizations and academia are participating in this first of the 15. B20 will discuss solutions through joint working of G20 countries.

RAISE is the theme of the meetings. RAISE stands for Responsible, Accelerated, Innovative, Sustainable and Equitable businesses.

Confederation of Indian Industries is providing the Secretariat of B20. Mr. Natrajan Chandrasekaran, Chairman of Tata Sons, a large industrial house of India, is the Chairman of B20 India.

This meeting is the first of the 15 different G20 meetings planned in Gujarat during India's Chairmanship of G20. Gandhinagar will host 10 of them. Two meetings will be hosted by Ahmedabad city. One meeting each will be organized in Surat, Kutch and Ektanagar.

The School requires a Mathematics Teacher for teaching Vedic Mathematics. Senior teachers of the school designed the puzzle as the advertisement. One has to solve the puzzle to find the telephone number for calling the School and for filing the application.

On the National Mathematics Day, on December 22, 2022, Gujarat's Education Minister had declared that Vedic Mathematics would be introduced from 6th to 10th Standards as a compulsory subject, in a phased manner. Kirit Joshi, a senior educationist, said, "It would improve the problem-solving ability of school students and help them solve sums faster. With the use of various formulae of Vedic math, students will not remain dependent on calculators for doing complex sums."

But he added that Vedic math could not replace modern math and that it would remain supplementary.

Vedic mathematics is an ancient Indian method which simplifies mathematics by integrating arithmetic operations into 16 'sutras' or formulae.
