Mexico: the Biggest Beneficiary of NALS X

Hanson points out that the Left-wing Mexican President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador praised President Joe Biden for nearly opening the borders of USA-Mexico to illegal immigration into USA. Mexico’s hard-working Mexicans send about \$60 billion annually to their families in Mexico. The drug cartels of Mexico earn about \$35-45 billion through illegal export of opioids to USA. The Declaration of North America refers to the Canada-U.S.-Mexico Agreement (CUSMA), which seeks to forge stronger regional supply chains, to boost regional competitiveness. The Declaration plans to convene public-private dialogues and map out supply chains to address common challenges and opportunities. The biggest beneficiary of the process is Mexico, which gets the largest share of investments, designed to create supply chains within the region, by avoiding East Asia and China. This is because it is in Mexico that the cheapest labour in the region is available.

Canada also committed to invest in a modern fleet of fighter jets to protect North American airspace.

Prime Minister Trudeau also reiterated Canada's ongoing commitment to providing humanitarian, military, financial, and other assistance to the government and people of Ukraine, and announced Canada's purchase of a National Advanced Surface-to-Air Missile System and associated munitions from the United States to donate to Ukraine at a cost of \$406 million. This air defense system helps protect against drone, missile, and aircraft attacks and has a high success rate. Such a system is yet to be made available to Canada's own armed forces.
