He is the Chairman of the Independent National Election Commission (INEC) of Nigeria. He spoke on a wide range of issues that will make the coming elections free and fair. He spoke extensively on logistics, that has been put in place. He also discussed the efforts, which were still ongoing, at various levels of preparation and which all would be completed before the elections in February.

The 2023 General Election belongs to the youths of Nigeria; the youths aged between 18 and 34 accounted for 37,060,399 representing 39.65% of the current total voter's registration across the country as reflected on INEC database. He also informed the gathering that the Presidential election will be held on Feb 25 and that the date is sacrosanct. He implored the local and international community to disregard any information that is contrary to the Feb 25 date of Presidential election and March 11 elections at States level.

The Bimodal Voter Accreditation System (BVAS) and the INEC Results Viewing (IReV) Portal shall be used in Voters' Accreditation and Result Viewing, during the elections, Prof Mahmood Yakubu affirmed.

The APC Presidential campaign:

The APC Presidential campaign Train moved to Ilorin Kwara State, North Central Nigeria on Monday January 16, 2023. Asiwaju Bola Ahmed Tinubu, the Party flag bearer led other party leaders to the campaign ground in Ilorin. It was a mammoth crowd, that turned out to welcome the party leaders.

Asiwaju Tinubu told the gathering about the need to cement the good governance, that they have enjoyed in the last 4 years under an APC controlled State Government in Kwara State.
