Israel: Netanyahu bows before mass protests March 28, 2023

March 27, 2023: Jerusalem: Thousands of Israelis had been protesting against the judicial overhaul plan of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu for about three months. After Netanyahu fired his defence minister, who spoke against the judicial overhaul, on Monday, workers from many areas of economy joined the strike. This would have paralysed the economy.

He said that he would work for obtaining a compromise with his political opponents during the summer session of parliament, which begins on April 30.

Netanyahu has been facing corruption charges in courts. The right-wing government felt that the judiciary had started becoming interventionist to implement a liberal agenda. So, the government said that its plans for judicial overhaul will restore the balance between the executive and judiciary. The demonstrators say that the proposed overhaul will undermine Israel's system of checks and balances.

Israel has a large number of parties and to have a coalition with a majority in the Parliament requires many compromises, which keeps the democracy at knife's edge. By **Dr K N Mistry**
