March 7-8, 2023: **Political Inclusion for Presiding Officers for Senate and National Assembly**: The Senators and House of Representatives members, elected at the elections of February 25-26, will be issued their Certificates of Return at the International Conference Centre (ICC) Abuja on Tuesday and Wednesday, March 7 and March 8.

Hence it must take initiative to ensure that the positions of the Senate President, the Speaker of the House, the Deputy Senate President, the Deputy Speaker and the Principal Officers are chosen so that all the geo-political zones and both the religions are represented in the new power structure.

March 6, 2023: **Preparing BVAS system for Elections of 11th March**: Saturday's Governorship and State Assembly elections require BVAS to be re-configured: The Court order granting the unsuccessful presidential candidates of PDP and Labour parties to do electronic scanning and make photocopies of voters' registration and ballot papers of the presidential elections of Feb 25-26. That means INEC cannot reconfigure BVAS for the elections of March 1, 2023.

Next Election: Governorship and State House of Assembly 11th March 2023 5days 8hours : 57mins : 18secs

The Court will have to terminate the facility for Atiku Abubakar and Peter Obi so that the elections of 11th March ae not required to be postponed.
