In 2012, he assumed the office of the Chancellor, UC San Diego. He has prepared the Strategic Plan and developed the University from 25,000 students to 43,000 students today. University of California, San Diego is one of the world's leading Research Universities of the world.

In February 2020, he was appointed by the Prime Minister of India on the Board of Governors of Academy for Research and Innovation in India. He is a member of the Board of Governors of SRM University – Amravati, India, Director of Reliance Foundation of Education and Research, and member of the advisory board of Semicon India.
