

Important Gujarat News: 2nd May

May 2, 2023

1. May 2-May 22, 2023: Admission to Professional Courses in Gujarat:

After the declaration of the results for the 12th Standard by the Gujarat Higher Secondary Board today, ACPC has started the process of admission to the Engineering and Pharmacy Colleges in Gujarat.



ADMISSION TO ENGINEERING PROGRAMS after 12th: On 6th June, the allotment of seats in the first round to engineering colleges will take place. Before that from June 1- June 5, the applicants can fill in their choice of the program, they want to join and can participate in a mock round of admission. The Final Merit List will be declared on 9th June and the allotment in the first round will take place on 16th June.

In Group A, about 44,000 students appeared in the examination and about 29,000 have passed the examination. These students can be admitted to the B.Sc. programs in their areas or in engineering programs.

The number of seats in the engineering Colleges is about 68,000.

ADMISSION TO PHARMACY PROGRAMS after 12th: The admission to the Pharmacy Colleges will begin on 9th May. The applicants to Pharmacy courses will be able to register online up to 16th June.

In Group B, about 79,000 students appeared in the examination. These students can be admitted to the B.Sc. programs in Life Sciences or in Pharmacy.

The number of seats in the 103 Pharmacy Colleges is 9,070.

2. May 2, 2023: Gujarat Secondary Education Board declares results of its 12th Standard (Science stream) Examination:



The number of students with A1 Grade is 61. Surat district, with 15 A1 students, has the largest number of students in the A1 list. In general, the result is poorer this year, since this is a cohort, which suffered indifferent education during Covid and the whole of the 9th class was promoted to Standard 10, without any examination.
