Forty-two years back, Sheikh Hasina had returned to Bangladesh on 17<sup>th</sup> May, six years after Sheikh Mujibur Rahman was killed at Gan Bhavan by some disgruntled army colonels.

Even though a secular democratic system has been put in place by Sheikh Hasina during her rule, Bangladesh has had a troubled history of coups by the army and collaboration of some political leaders, with those who opposed the freedom struggle by Mukti Vahini in 1971.

Sheikh Hasina said that after returning home, her only target was to bring back the country on the path of the Liberation War spirit and to see that Bangladesh's true history was known to the young.

"We will bring smiles on the faces of the distressed people and build 'Sonar Bangla' as dreamt by the Father of the Nation," she said.

**May 17, 2023**: **Ganatantra Mancha**, an alliance of seven political parties, has declared two road marches in Dhaka South and Dhaka North on May 23 and May 28 respectively. It will be followed by a road march towards Dinajpur from Dhaka on June 4 to June 6.

**Saiful Haque**, coordinator of the alliance and general secretary of **Bangladesh-er Biplobi Workers Party**, said that the people in the country were going through extreme hardship due to price hike of essential commodities, including food, the crisis of gas, electricity and repeated hikes in the prices of utility service.

The only other major party in the opposition is **Bangladesh Nationalist Party** (BNP), which is in alliance with Jamaat. BNP has given mixed signals about its participation in the January 2024 elections.

In 2021, at Durga Puja, simultaneous attacks on a number of Hindu temples were organized. Many observers suspect that these attacks were designed as a protest against Awami League government by a section of the opposition.
