The state dinner, held in a large, well-decorated tent on the White House South Lawn, featured a number of Silicon Valley executives on the guest list, including Apple's Tim Cook, Mr. Satya Nadella & Mrs. Anu Nadella, Mr. Sunil Wadhwani & Mrs. Nita Wadhwani, 23andMe CEO Anne Wojcicki, Google CEO Sundar Pichai and & Mrs. Anjali Pichai, OpenAl CEO Sam Altman, Ms. Indra Nooyi & Mr. Raj Nooyi, Mr. Mukesh Ambani & Ms. Nita Ambani of Reliance Industries, Mr. Anand Mahindra, Dr. Hiren Joshi, Officer on Special Duty, Republic of India among its 400 guests.

With the slightly Indian-accented dinner, the Bidens followed a White House tradition of serving guests from abroad food that has <u>faint</u> echoes of home with a strong American bent.
