China Coast Guard uses Water Cannons against Philippine Vessels

August 6, 2023: The Philippines on Sunday condemned China Coast Guard latest string of incidents in the disputed waters, **the third incident this year** where they used water cannons against its vessels heading for a resupply mission of its men in the West Philippine Sea.

The Tweet (given on the next page in Appendix 1) by Commodore Jay Tarriela, a spokesperson of the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) points out the aggressiveness of China in West Philippine Sea (called as South China Sea by China).

PCG vessels were carrying supplies to the military garrison, stationed in Ayungin Shoal, also known as Second Thomas Shoal (called as Renai Reef by China), in the Spratly Islands chain (called as Nansha Islands by China). Some China Coast Guard (CCG) vessels blocked the path of the Philippine Naval vessels and attacked them with water cannon.

Beijing has claims over the entire 1.3 million square mile South China Sea and most of the islands, including the Spratlys, an archipelago consisting of 100 small islands and reefs. Some of the islands and reefs in the Spratlys are claimed by the Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei and Taiwan also.

Gan Yu, a spokesman of CCG, re-iterated China's territorial claims on the Ayungin Shoal and the West Philippine Sea. Gan Yu said that CCG "implemented

the necessary controls in accordance with the law and prevented the Philippine vessels carrying the illegal construction materials". The spokesman urged the Philippine side to "immediately stop its infringing activities in that maritime area".

The US State Department voiced US support for the Philippines and called on China to respect the freedom of navigation. "(China) has no lawful claim to the maritime area around Second Thomas Shoal," it said in a statement published on 5th August 2023.

Philippines has been wavering between its attempts "to garner the support of USA and others" and "to placate China" so that China accepts the judgement of the International Court of Justice, which found Philippine's claims on the islands and seas (claimed by China also) to be just.

The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) strongly condemns the China Coast Guard's (CCG's) dangerous maneuvers and illegal use of water cannons against the PCG vessels escorting the indigenous boats chartered by the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) yesterday, 5 August 2023. These boats were delivering food, water, fuel and other supplies to our military troops stationed on BRP Sierra Madre in Ayungin Shoal. Such actions by the CCG not only disregarded the safety of the PCG crew and the supply boats but also violated international law, including the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), the 1972 Convention on the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREGS), and the 2016 Arbitral Award.

The @coastguardph calls on the China Coast Guard to restrain its forces, respect the sovereign rights of the Philippines in its exclusive economic zone and continental shelf, refrain from hampering freedom of navigation, and take appropriate actions against the individuals involved in this unlawful incident. We ask that China Coast Guard, as an organization with a responsibility to observe state obligations under UNCLOS, COLREGs, and other relevant instruments of international maritime safety and security, to cease all illegal activities within the maritime zones of the Philippines.
