

President Tinubu in India for G20 Summit; Guinea-Bissau prepares against coups

Before **the G20 summit** scheduled on **September 9 – 10, 2023**, President Tinubu will attend several high-level meetings and engagements with other world leaders and business executives on the sidelines of the Summit.

The President will also meet with the Nigerian community in India.

The President is accompanied by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, **Yusuf Tuggar**; Finance and Coordinating Minister of the Economy, **Wale Edun**; the Minister of Communications, Innovation and Digital Economy, **Dr. Bosun Tijani**, and the Minister for Industry, Trade and Investment, **Dr. Doris Uzoka-Anite**.

The journey to India, ostensibly for G20 Summit, is a continuation of President Tinubu's drive to rejuvenate and revitalize the Nigerian economy. His delegation,

consisting of cabinet Ministers and Businessmen is to showcase Nigeria's readiness to collaborate meaningfully for sustainable economic development.

September 4, 2023: Bissau, Guinea-Bissau: Guinea-Bissau's **President Umaro Sissoco Embalo** has appointed two new officials to protect his security.

Due to coups d'état in **Niger** and **Gabon**, where the Presidential Guard has carried out the coups, **President Embalo** has appointed two new officials to protect the President. **General Tomas Djassi** was named as head of presidential security, while **General Horta Inta** was appointed as chief of staff for the president.

Guinea-Bissau, a member of ECOWAS, has suffered four military coups since independence in 1974 from Portugal, most recently in 2012.

An attempt to overthrow Embalo took place in February 2022.
