

## India & Canada: Killing of a Khalistani in Surrey, British Columbia

October 13, 2023

In the **Canadian Parliament**: On **September 18, 2023**, in the House of Commons, Prime Minister Justin Trudeau stated that “Canadian security agencies have been actively pursuing **credible allegations** of a potential link between **agents of the government of India** and the killing of a Canadian citizen, Hardeep Singh Nijjar”.



On **June 18, 2023**, **Hardeep Singh Nijjar** was shot dead outside a Sikh temple in Surrey, B.C. by two persons, riding a bike. Till today, the Police in Canada has been unable to catch any one of the two persons.

The Indian Government’s spokesman, in response, pointed out that **Hardeep Singh Nijjar was a terrorist**, who was involved in many violent incidents in India, including the murder of a Minister of the State Government of Punjab in India. The Indian spokesperson added, “**A red-corner notice** had been issued through Interpol, more than two years back. Even though India and Canada have an Extradition Treaty for criminals, the Canadian Government had not taken any action.”

ANOTHER KILLING in CANADA: There are many gangsters from Punjab, who have found shelter in Canada. They not only manage murders in Punjab and India, they are known to be active in such activities in Canada also.

On Wednesday, 20<sup>th</sup> September 2023, **Sukhdool Singh** alias **Sukha Duneke**, who lives in Canada, was bumped off by a rival Khalistani gangster group led by the jailed gang-leader **Lawrence Bishnoi**. Sukha was a close associate of **Arshdeep**

**Dalla**, a terrorist of the **Khalistan Tiger Force** and he had fled to Canada in 2017 on a forged Passport.

ACTION BY FOREIGN OFFICES of CANADA and INDIA: After PM Trudeau's statement, the Foreign Affairs Minister **Mélanie Joly** said she had ordered the expulsion of "a senior Indian diplomat." Joly's office said that the diplomat is **Pavan Kumar Rai**, the head of the **Research and Analysis Wing (RAW)**, India's foreign intelligence agency, in Canada.

India, as a retaliatory measure, expelled the corresponding CSIS officer in the Canadian consulate in India, without revealing the name of the Officer.

USUAL COURTESY not ACCORDED by Canada: The Intelligence agencies of friendly countries remain in touch with one another through stationing of an Intelligence Agent in their consulates. Thus there was a CSIS officer in the Canadian Consulate in India, as there was a RAW officer in the Indian Consulate in Canada. When due to any reason, any such officer is expelled, **the practice is that the name of such an officer is not revealed.**

These public actions led to public reactions, as in the tweet by a well-known Journalist in India: dated Oct 6, 2023:

In a new twist to the India and Canada diplomatic war, Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar's son **Balraj Nijjar** has dropped a big bombshell. He

claimed the proximity of his father with Canadian Intelligence agencies days before he was killed outside gurudwara in Surrey on June 18th this year. Balraj also claimed that the intelligence authorities advised Nijjar to stay at home.

India Today, the premier TV channel of India, said that CSIS must inform the world what kind of business did a plumber like Nijjar, with a red-corner notice by Interpol against him and was doing with CSIS. India Today speculated that Nijjar was an Agent of CSIS. **If it turns out that a terrorist, accused of managing the murder of a Minister of Punjab State , India was a CSIS agent, it would directly involve the Canadian Government Agency in terrorism in India.**

The public opinion in both Canada and India is growing as if the two countries were **adversaries, due to Prime Minister Trudeau's public statement**, when the proof for the complicity of the Indian Government in Nijjar's killing did not yet exist with him, as confirmed by the Premier of British Columbia.

Inderjeet Singh has reported a new opinion poll, in his Tweet (@Warrior9Singh) dated Oct 13, 2023 to say that a "majority of Canadians **believe PM Justin Trudeau**' statement that **India was involved in the assassination** of the Khalistan referendum leader Nijjar in British Columbia.
