India: Chhattisgarh State Elections: BJP wins over Ruling party

December 3, 2023: New Delhi, India: The results of Chattisgarh stunned all the Election Psephologists, with BJP winning in all the regions of the State, including the **tribal belts of Bastar and Sarguja**. The **tribals and women** are supposed to have powered the surprising victory of BJP over INC.

The **Zoram People's Movement** (ZPM), under the leadership of **Lalduhoma**, won 27 of 40 seats, while the ruling **Mizo National Front** (MNF) could win just 10. **Bharatiya Janata Party** (BJP) could win 2 seats and the **Indian National Congress** won only one seat.



FORESTS: Deciduous forests of the Eastern Highlands Forests cover roughly **44% of the state**. The state has the third largest forest by area in India.

The state is surrounded by the forests in Madhya Pradesh (1st), Odisha (4th), Maharashtra (5th), Jharkhand and Telangana making it India's largest covered forests across state boundaries. There are multiple National Parks, Tiger Reserves across the state. Achanakmar-Amarkantak Biosphere Reserve is UNESCO recognised Biosphere with total area of 3835.51 Km².

TRIBES: There are many different tribes in the forests. Moreover, in the forests, spread over six States, the smaller tribes can move from one area to another.

The largest tribe of Chhattisgarh is in Bastar. Located at a distance of 264 km from Raipur, Bastar has plenty to offer to its visitors with its valuable tribal art and culture that lie in and around the lush green city of **Jagdalpur**, situated on the banks of **Indravati river**.

A BRIEF HISTORY: Bastar was called **Dakshin Koshal**, which finds mention in both the **Ramayana and Mahabharata**. The forest area was called **Dandakaranya** in the epic Ramayana.

Bastar state was a **princely state** in India during the British Raj. It was founded in the **early 14th century** by **Annamaraja**, a brother of the last ruler of the Kakatiya dynasty (12-14 century and ruled over much of the present day **Telangana** and **Andhra Pradesh**, and **parts of Eastern Karnataka**, **Northern Tamil Nadu**, and **Southern Odisha**. Their capital was **Orugallu**, now known as **Warangal**.), Prataparudra II.

Dussehra celebration of Bastar is said to have a special flavour.

TOURIST PLACES in BASTAR: One can choose from **National Parks**, waterfalls, natural caves, palaces, museums and places of religious significance.
