May 7, 2024: **Ahmedabad**, Gujarat, India: When **Narendra Modi** came out of the polling booth, he found that a big crowd had assembled, with slogans of Modi, Modi. On the day of polling, no electioneering is permitted. So, he walked towards the crowd. An old woman tied a "Raksha Bandhan" (expressing her BEST WISHES) and a young girl asked for his autograph. Then someone brought a andheld microphone to him. Modi said," Let each of us vote. In addition, please take care of your health in this hot season. Please take a lot of water."

The local newspaper 'Sandesh' carried an article titled — "Today is a Sacred Day for a Resolve to Build an India of the Future" by Dr. Ajit Sinh Rana, a popular columnist. The article said that the ten years of Modi's Prime-Ministership were a period of Empowerment, Social Justice and Inclusion. Dr. Rana said that Modi had

worked for uniting people in National Interest and had worked to weaken the forces, which try to break the society on the basis of caste or identity. He said this had strengthened democracy in India and made it more vibrant.

---- A Brief SUMMARY of THREE PHASES of Indian GENERAL ELECTIONS 2024----

Phase 1: During this phase, of April 19, 2024, voters in 102 constituencies spread across 12 States and Union Territories cast their ballots.

Odisha, Sikkim and **Arunachal Pradesh** completed their election to all their MP's constituencies.:

The following are some of the constituencies in the 1st phase:

- Coimbatore: The leading candidates are: Tamil Nadu Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Chief K Annamalai, facing off against Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam's (DMK's) Ganapathy P Rajkumar and All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam's (ADMK's) Singai G Ramachandran.
- 2. Nilgiris (Reserved): The incumbent DMK's **A. Raja** faces **L Murugan** from the BJP and **Logesh Tamilselvan D** from ADMK.
- 3. Ramanathapuram: It is a coastal constituency with dominant Muslims, Christians, and the fishing community. Indian Union Muslim League's (IUML's) K Navas Kani won from this constituency in 2019. In 2024, K Navas Kani, from IUML backed by DMK, sees OP Panneerselvam, contesting as an Independent with BJP support, P Jeyaperumal from ADMK as the main competitors. The BJP has raised the issue of handing over Katchatheevu islet to Sri Lanka as a campaign issue.
- 4. Pilibhit: This constituency of Uttar Pradesh (UP) is represented, at present, by Varun Gandhi of BJP. For 2024, the candidates are: Jitin Prasada from BJP, Bhagwat Saran Gangwar from Samajwadi Party (SP), Anis Ahmed Khan from Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP)
- 5. Nagina, located in UP at the border with **Uttarakhand** (UK): The candidates for the General Election are: **Chandrashekhar Azad** from **Azaad Samaj Party-Kanshi Ram** (ASP-KR), **Surendra Pal Singh** from BSP, **Om Kumar** from BJP, and **Manoj Kumar** from SP. The seat was held by BSP's **Girish Chandra** in 2019.

- 6. Cooch Behar in West Bengal: **Rajbanshi leader Nisith Pramanik** of BJP is defending his seat from the challenger candidate of **All India Trinamool Congress** (AITC or TMC).
- 7. Chhindwara, located in **Madhya Pradesh** (MP): Chhindwara, a Congress stronghold represented by **Nakul Nath** since 2019, faces a formidable challenge from **Bunty Vivek Sahu** of BJP. Chhindwara is the stronghold of **Kamal Nath**, the father of **Nakul Nath**.
- 8. Gaya, located in Bihar State: Gaya will witness a battle between **Jitan Ram Manjhi**, 80, of **Hindustani Awam Morcha** (HAM) and **Kumar Sarvjeet Paswan**, 49, of RJD. Former CM **Manjhi** seeks reelection against the son of **Rajesh Kumar** (late), his first opponent in Gaya.
- 9. Haridwar: Candidates: former CM **Trivendra Singh Rawat** of BJP and **Virender**, son of **Harish Rawat**, former CM of **Indian National Congress** (INC).

Phase 2: The second phase took place on April 26 at 88 constituencies across 13 States and Union Territories.

Will the electorate of **Thiruvananthapuram**, through a fair process, defenestrate (means "to throw somebody out of a window") **Shashi Tharoor** (INC) and elect the Union minister **Rajeev Chandrasekhar** (BJP)? A **Communist Party of India** (CPI) candidate is also in the fray.



Thiruvananthapuram candidates:

Shashi Tharoor (INC), Rajeev Chandrasekhar (BJP) and Pannyan Raveendran (CPI) BJP candidate has won the Bangalore South Lok Sabha constituency of Karnataka State in 2009, 2014, and 2019. Will **Tejasvi Surya** be able to win it for BJP against **Sowmya Reddy** of INC?

Similarly, Hema Malini had won the Mathura constituency of UP in 2014, and 2019. Will Hema Malini be able to retain it for BJP against **Mukesh Dhangar** of INC and Suresh Singh of BSP?

BJP's Arun Govil is campaigning for the Lok Sabha constituency of Meerut in UP. The Samajwadi Party's Atul Pradhan, who is currently the MLA from Sardhana Constituency in Meerut district, is the candidate fighting against him.

The former Karnataka chief minister **HD Kumaraswamy** is contesting from the **Mandya constituency** as an **National Democratic Alliance** (NDA) candidate. **Venkataramane Gowda** alias 'Star Chandru' is the INC candidate against him.

Kerala State voted for all its MP constituencies during the 2nd phase.

Phase 3: The third phase of voting occurred on May 7, 2024, in 93 constituencies spread across 11 states and Union Territories Some of the high-stakes battles, during the 3rd phase are as follows:

- Amit Shah in Gandhinagar: The Union Home Minister contested from Gandhinagar.
- Dimple Yadav in Mainpuri: Dimple Yadav, wife of former Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav, contested from Mainpuri.

- **Jyotiraditya Scindia** in **Guna**: Jyotiraditya Scindia, who recently switched from the Indian National Congress to the Bharatiya Janata Party, contested from Guna.
- Shivraj Singh Chouhan in Vidisha: The former Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh contested from Vidisha.
- Supriya Sule in Baramati: Supriya Sule, daughter of Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) leader Sharad Pawar, contested from Baramati.

Two major States of Karnataka and Gujarat completed the elections of all their Parliamentary constituencies in Phase 3.

Voter turnout remained robust, reflecting citizens' commitment to democracy.
