June 11, 2024: Bhubaneshwar, State of Odisha: At a meeting of all the **Members of Legislative Assembly** (MLAs) of Odisha, elected on the BJP tickets, **Mohan Charan Majhi** was elected as the Leader of the Party in the Legislative Assembly of Odisha. **Raghubar Das**, Governor of Odisha, is likely to invite him to be the **Chief Minister** of the State. In Odisha, this will be the BJP's 1st Government, in which BJP is not a junior partner in a coalition with a larger party.

J.P. Nadda, the President of BJP, had nominated **Rajnath Singh**, 73, (an ex-President of BJP and at present the Defense Minister of India) and his Cabinet colleague **Bhupender Yadav**, 54, (an ex- national general secretary of BJP and at present the Minister of Environment, Forest and Climate Change) as the Central Observers for conduct of the election.

Rajnath Singh announced through an X," Delighted to announce that Shri Mohan Charan Majhi has been elected unanimously as the leader of Odisha BJP Legislature Party. ..Also, it has been decided that two Deputy Chief Ministers will be designated to head the new State Government. Shri KV Singh Deo and Smt. Pravati Parida will serve the state as Deputy Chief Minister. Congratulations to them!" ---- A BACKGROUNDER on the new CM and Deputy CMs of **Odisha** ----ABOUT MOHAN MAJHI, the new CM: **Mohan Charan Majhi**, the new Chief Minister, is a four-time MLA **from Keonjhar**, Mohan Charan Majhi is the new Chief Minister of Odisha. Hailing from the tribal community, the 53-year-old has strong links to the **Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh** (RSS).

In the 2024 Odisha Assembly elections, **Majhi** defeated the **Biju Janata Dal**'s (BJD's) *Mina Majhi* by a margin of 11,577 votes.

Mohan Charan Majhi was first elected to the Odisha Legislative Assembly from the Keonjhar constituency in 2000. He won the seat again in 2004. He was the Chief Whip of the Coalition Government of BJP and BJD from 2005 to 2009.

Majhi faced defeat in two consecutive Assembly polls, first in 2009 against a BJD candidate - *Subarna Naik*, and then in 2014 against BJD candidate *Abhiram Naik*.

Mohan Majhi's political career began as a **Sarpanch** ("an elected Head of a village") in 1997. Now, as the new Chief Minister of Odisha, Mohan Charan Majhi is set to lead the state.

ABOUT K.V. SINGH DEO, the new DEPUTY CM: **Kanak Vardhan Singh Deo**, a member of the erstwhile **royal family of the princely state of Patnagarh in Bolangir**, Odisha, is to serve as the **Deputy Chief Minister** of Odisha. At the 2024 elections, he has won from the Patnagarh Assembly Constituency, on a BJP ticket. Earlier, he had won from the same constituency five consecutive times before being defeated by BJD's *Saroj Kumar Meher* in 2019. He had also served as the **Cabinet Minister of Industry and Public Enterprise from 2000 to 2009** in the **Naveen Patnaik**-led Coalition Government of BJD and BJP.

Singh Deo was also the ex-State President of the Odisha unit of BJP.

K.V. Singh Deo is also a member of the National Executive of BJP. Singh Deo completed his Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) from Delhi University. His wife, Sangeeta Kumari Singh Deo served as a Member of the Indian Parliament (MP) in the 12th, 13th, and 14th Lok Sabhas. She contested elections on the BJP ticket from the Bolangir constituency in Odisha and secured victory in 1998, 1999, and 2004. However, in subsequent elections, she faced defeat to her husband's first cousin,

Kalikesh Singh Deo, who is a prominent member of BJD. **Sangeeta Kumari Singh Deo** won the election in 2019 for BJP and is an MP in the 17th Lok Sabha.

On June 11, 2024, K.V. Singh Deo was elected as the Deputy Chief Minister of Odisha, along with **Pravati Parida**, following the 2024 Odisha Legislative Assembly election.

Singh Deo (b. June 14, 1956) completed his Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) from Delhi University. His wife, **Sangeeta Kumari Singh Deo**, has also been active in politics, serving as a **Lok Sabha** member ("Member of the Indian Parliament").

ABOUT PRAVATI PARIDA, the new DEPUTY CM: **Pravati Parida** (b. 1967) won the 2024 Odisha Legislative Assembly election from the **Nimapara Assembly Constituency in Puri District by** defeating *Dilip Kumar Nayak* of BJD by 4,588 votes. Parida completed **her LLB at Utkal University** and later pursued an **M.A. in Public Administration** from the same institution.

She has enrolled as an Advocate at the Odisha High Court.

Pravati Parida has worked as the Chief of the Women's Wing of BJP's Odisha unit.

The electorate of **Thiruvananthapuram**, through a fair process, re-elected **Shashi Tharoor** (INC), albeit with a reduced majority. The Union minister **Rajeev Chandrasekhar** (BJP) lost the election and was dropped from the new Cabinet, which was sworn in on June 9, 2024. The **Communist Party of India** (CPI) candidate lost the election again.

Voter turnout remained robust, reflecting citizens' commitment to democracy.
