

## Election 2024: Donald Trump, Kamala Harris Polls and Odds

September 13, 2024: Washington D.C., USA: After the 2<sup>nd</sup> presidential debate, most of the media reported that Democratic U.S. Vice President **Kamala Harris** had increased her lead over Republican **Donald Trump**. **Kamala Harris** was said to lead 47% to 42% over Republican **Donald Trump** in the race to win the November 4 presidential election, according to a Reuters/ Ipsos poll that closed on Thursday. In an Aug. 21-28 Reuters/Ipsos poll, **Harris had four-point advantage over Trump** among registered voters.

The presidential debate took place in Philadelphia at the National Constitutional Center on Tuesday, September 10, 2024. "World News Tonight" anchor and managing editor **David Muir**, along with ABC News Live "Prime" anchor **Linsey Davis**, served as the moderators.

Governor **Walz** will see **JD Vance** on October 1, 2024 in a vice-presidential debate. The world may have another opportunity to see the Vice-President **Kamla Harris** and former President **Donald Trump** on the debate stage in October 2024.

The 2024 U.S. presidential election campaign is one of the closest races in recent history. Initially, polls showed former President **Donald Trump** holding a consistent

lead over incumbent President **Joe Biden**, with margins typically ranging from 2-4 %age points. However, the political landscape underwent a seismic shift when **Biden** withdrew from the race after a disastrous debate Vice-President **Kamala Harris, Donald Trump: Latest Poll Results**: In the days following Tuesday's presidential debate, Vice-President **Kamala Harris** maintains her narrow polling lead over former President Donald Trump.

As of early morning September 13, **Polling Aggregator FiveThirtyEight** put Harris 2.8-points ahead in the national polls.

The Democratic Vice-President **Kamala Harris** had 47 percent support, while her Republican rival had 44.4 percent.

The most recent update to **Nate Silver's election poll averages on the Silver Bulletin blog** saw Harris at 48.6 percent, and Trump at 46.2 percent.

Meanwhile, **Aggregator Real Clear Polling** also had **Harris** ahead of **Trump**, with 48.6 percent support, while the Republican had 46.9 percent support.

This time last year, Real Clear Polling found Trump to be leading nationally, though only by a hair—Trump was 0.4 points ahead of then-candidate President Joe Biden, with 44.8 percent support.

Among voters who said they had heard at least something about Tuesday's debate, 53% said **Harris** won and 24% said **Trump** won, with the rest saying neither had. Some 52% of those familiar with the debate said **Trump stumbled and didn't appear sharp**, while 21% said that of **Harris**. Among Republican voters, one in five said **Trump** didn't appear sharp.

**Harris**, 59, put **Trump**, 78, on the defensive in a combative presidential debate with a stream of attacks on his fitness for office and his myriad legal woes, highlighting **Trump's** felony conviction on charges of falsification of business records. Some 52% of voters familiar with the debate said **Harris** "gave the impression of having higher moral integrity," compared to 29% who said the same of **Trump**.
